Subject: **AB 109: Release Decision Guidance Tools**

With the introduction and impending implementation of Assembly Bill 109, jail over-crowding only stands to get worse. This adds additional stress to those jails having a high percentage of pre-trial and pre-sentence offenders awaiting their next hearing from an overburdened court system. Presently, many jails make their release decisions based on the offender's current offense. Unfortunately, the research is clear that this method does not predict risk to re-offend.

Identification of offenders who are at high risk to re-offend/high probability to return to court must drive release decisions. Fortunately, through the use of validated, actuarial risk assessment tools, corrections officials can better identify those high-risk offenders. The choices must be made, inmates will be released. Shouldn't those choices be made on solid, validated information obtained from a quality risk assessment?
